Stimulate the senses and the imagination with art camps. The Mint provides fun and creative inspiration for children of all ages and abilities. Begin in the galleries to learn about media and techniques used in original works of art. Classroom lessons explore hands-on art activities in both two-dimensional and three-dimensional formats. Class size is limited. Classes that are designated as **FULL** are taking a waitlist in the event of cancelations.

Mini-Masters Classes Tuesday-Thursday 10-11:30 a.m.

Tuition: \$35/members & \$55/non-members

For children ages 3-5 accompanied by an adult.

Use line, shape, color and texture to create your own artworks.

June 29-July 1: Tea with the Black Dragon FULL

Explore the Asian art collection as you learn about the Chinese Court and the special powers of the Chinese black dragon.

July 6-8: A Little Blue FULL

Explore the magic of color as you make your own mini-master museum paintings to take home.

July 27-29: An Animal Safari FULL

Take a trip through African animal stories as you make your own cloth designs, masks and small sculptures.

Students explore a variety of techniques with sculpture, printmaking, drawing and painting. Exploration of works on display in the galleries inspires and informs activities. All classes are taught by master teachers from public and private schools in the area.

July 19-23 Writing with Pictures Grades 5-8

Comic art is pictorial storytelling. Students will learn how to express their own ideas through sequential pictures that tell a story. An exploration of the Museum's galleries will provide the inspiration for students to plan and create their own mini-comic book. Materials are provided.

Teen Camps Monday-Friday 9 a.m.-1 p.m.

Tuition: \$130/members & \$150/non-members

Teen workshops are designed for students who have already developed graphic skills and are considering a career in the arts or who wish to prepare a body of work toward an **AP** or **IB** portfolio.

July 12-16 Journeyman Ages 13-17 **FULL**

This class is designed for those wishing to increase their skill in drawing from observation. Emphasis is on **breadth** of exploration in a wide variety of media and techniques. Materials are provided. (Class may be repeated multiple times without doing the same activities.)

July 12-16 Personal Voice Ages 15-17

This class is designed to assist students in developing an understanding of the **concentration** component required for AP and IB portfolios. The intent is to help students develop work that demonstrates both a personal style and a consistent direction of exploration. Materials are provided.
